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The School and Philosophy

PMA, founded in 1958 by the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary, a Catholic, co-educational, college preparatory high school for students, grades 9-12. The student body represents 24 local communities, three states and nine countries. Students represent a variety of ethnic, religious, and socio-economic backgrounds. Admission to PMA is competitive and is based on a student's past academic record, performance on the High School Placement Exam, and teacher and administrator recommendations. PMA offers the unique opportunity of high quality academic programs, which cultivate the intellectual, emotional, creative, spiritual, physical, and aesthetic faculties of its students. Encouraging positive self-image, self-discipline, leadership, and academic excellence are worthy goals that lead to the service of God and the betterment of human kind.

Tuition

Tuition for the 2015-16 school year is \$11,000; it is inclusive of most fees. Exceptions include uniforms, iPad, and books.

Academic Program

All academic course offerings are college preparatory. The school year is divided into four quarters. Class periods are forty-five minutes, with extended time for Advanced Placement classes. Each student must take a minimum of six courses per year. Students must earn a minimum of 25 credits to graduate. Honors and Advanced Placement courses are offered for qualified students.

Honors Courses include Introduction to Literature, English Literature, American Literature, Great Books, Algebra I/II, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, Statistics, World History, American History I/II, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Anatomy & Physiology, Spanish I/II/III/IV, and French I/II/III/IV. Other honors classes may be taken on-line.

Advanced Placement Courses are offered in English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Spanish Language, French Language, United States History, Biology, and Chemistry. Other AP classes may be taken on-line.
